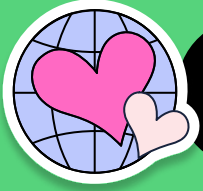

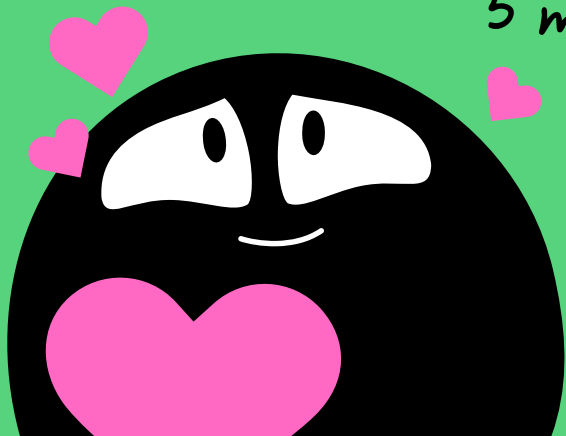
Giving Back

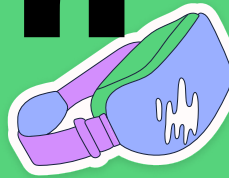

Screen-free activity

Build a giving habit and spark conversations that matter with your kids.

You'll Need:

a jar or container



colouring pencils

Cheap wrapped lollies



Instructions

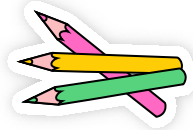
1. Print and colour the label on the next page and stick to the jar.
2. Fill it up with wrapped lollies and place it somewhere visible.
3. Explain that you're all going to save money to donate to help others. The lollies are a little thank-you.
4. When the lollies are gone, count the money together and decide how to donate it. Talk about how the money will be used, and the difference it will make.
5. Repeat the activity, but put the lollies out of sight and only give them if asked. Once giving becomes a habit, you won't need lollies at all.



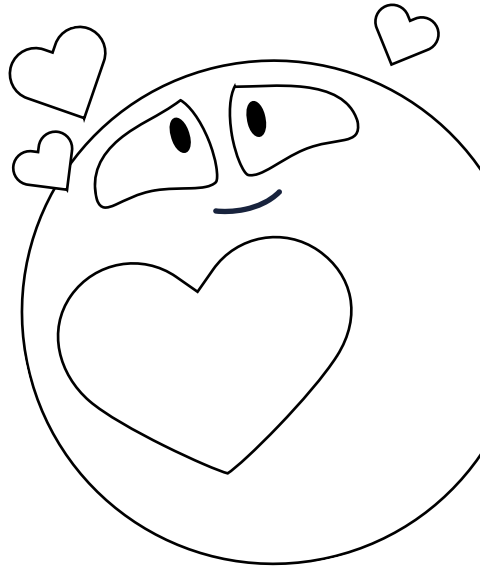
